At approximately 1700 hrs. this date 10/18/11 I was dispatched to 210 Kopchak Rd. Zanesville, Ohio 43701 to investigate a report of a lion in the back yard of that residence. Upon arrival at the TERRY THOMPSON residence which is immediately north of 310 Kopchak Rd. I noticed that there were several wild animals running around inside the fence of the Thompson residence. There was a Black Bear and at least two African Lions.

I made several attempts to contact Thompson by telephone and was unable to find anyone. A short time later LT. RINE of the State Highway Patrol arrived. At that point Lt. Rine and I decided to shut down Kopchak Rd. He dispatched one of his units to the intersection of US 40 and Kopchak and I had another unit (I do not recall who) go to Ridge Rd. and Kopchak Rd.

Sometime during all this two of the deputies assigned to my shift discharged their weapons. A wolf who had gotten outside the fence was shot and killed as well as a Black Bear.

The gate to the Thompson residence was locked. An employee of FRED POLKS lifted the gate up from the pin where it was allowing me to drive up to the residence to attempt to contact Thompson. When I got up to the residence I noticed that there were several more animals running loose including several lions, a mountain lion, a tiger, and more Black Bears. It appeared as if the doors of the pens were opened. I parked outside of the Thompson residence and sounded my horn but got no response.

I then drove back to the outside of the gate. A few minutes later a male who identified himself as an employee of Thompsons arrived. This was later identified as JOHN MOORE. Moore told me that Thompson should be at the residence. At this point I began concerned for Thompson's welfare. Moore drove with me back up to the house. We did enter the house and searched the inside of the house but were unable to find anyone in there. There were two monkeys and a small dog.

On the way out the driveway Moore looked and stated that he thought he saw someone lying just over an embankment near the barn. I stopped and looked. It did appear to be the dead body of a person. Due to the fact that there was a white tiger near the body which appeared to be eating the body I did not approach to try to identify it or see if the person was still alive.

I then drove down to the gate where I spoke with CAPT. LECOCQ and SHERIFF LUTZ. By this time several members of the Special Response Team with automatic weapons had arrived. At Sheriff Lutz's request I drove DEP. TODD KANAVEL's personal vehicle which is a pickup truck with several other deputies with

automatic weapons up to near the house. I drove around while they shot numerous wild animals.

A short time later Detective Captain WELKER and Det. CRAIG KNOX arrived. I assisted them in processing the crime scene and collecting evidence as well as loading the body of the Terry Thompson.

On October 18, 2011 I arrived at 310 Kopchak Rd. in Zanesville, Ohio at 5:58 p.m. which is the property owned by Terry Thompson. Prior to my arrival Dep. JONATHAN MERRY had already dispatched a Black Bear at the entrance gate of the property and also a lion south of the location on Kopchak Rd. LT. RYAN of the Ohio State Highway Patrol was also on the scene and advised me that there was a Bengal Tiger laying along the fence line. The tiger was approximately 30 to 40 feet from the fence of the property along Kopchak Rd. He advised me that the Bengal Tiger had not moved in approximately 20 minutes however shortly after that conversation I observed a large Black Bear heading towards the Bengal Tiger. The tiger began to stand up. At this point I dispatched both the Bengal Tiger and the Black Bear. When Sheriff Lutz's arrived on the scene he directed Jonathan Merry and I to assist the State Highway Patrol Officers that were on I-10 eastbound near the 152 exit. They had shot a wolf that had ran off of the property.

When Dep. Merry and I arrived at the State Trooper's location they advised us that the wolf was down but still breathing. At this point Dep. Merry dispatched the wolf. A short time later Dep. Merry and I observed two male African Lions along the fence line of the property a short distance from I-70. At this point we dispatched both of those African Lions and then later dispatched a Bengal Tiger that was also close to the fence line. After dispatching the Bengal Tiger one of the African Lions that we had shot got up and started running towards us. At this point we opened fire on it again eventually killing it.

Prior to us clearing the scene at 10:47 p.m. we also dispatched a Black Bear that was coming off of Thompson's property towards I-70.

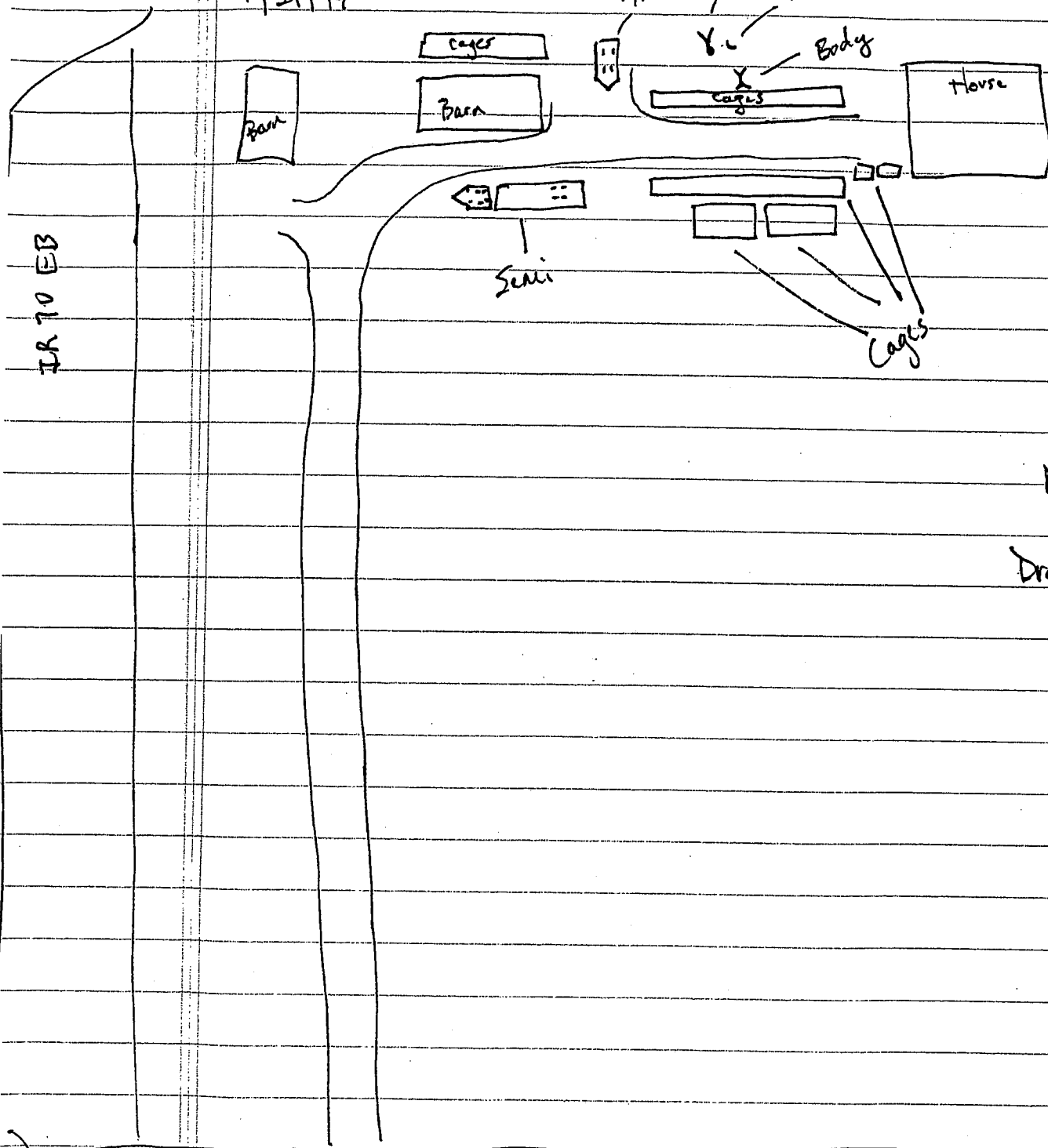

On October 18th, 2011 at about 6:30 PM I was called from home as I was the On-Call Detective. Dispatch advised that Terry Thompson's animals have been turned loose and it appears Terry is dead...possibly by his own hands. I asked that Det Knox also be called out to handle evidence. I was told he was already on the scene and Capt Steve Welker was on his way.

On the way I stopped by the office to pick up a Nikon camera for Det Knox and then I went to "T's World".

Arriving there by about 7:30 I met up with Capt Welker and Det Knox. There were many officers from MCSO, OSHP and EMA staging at the gate along Kopchak Road.

There was sporadic gunfire heard coming from the area of the Thompson house and barn.

Shortly, a Washington Twsp FD SUV towing a portable light plant arrived. Capt Welker, Det Knox and MCSO Dep Pitcock hitched a ride to the scene.

Up at the barn the MCSO SRT and other officers were busy trying to contain animals but having to resort to dispatching some on a regular basis. The only way we could move to Terry's body was with an armed perimeter around us.

We made one trip to the area where Terry was shot and then dragged where some photos were taken. He was laying in front of some animal pens that were situated along the east side of the driveway between the barn and the house. These pens face the field, not the driveway. Terry's body appeared to have been dragged towards the pens from an area about 20 feet away where there was an area of blood, a stainless steel revolver, a set of bolt-cutters and a ball cap. This area was about 1/3 the way from the barn to the house.

After taking some photos, we retreated back to an area of relative safety near the barn to make a decision on when and how to remove the body.

Armed with my department issued shotgun loaded with department issued 00 Buckshot, I assisted with holding the perimeter. I was stationed on the driveway between the barn and some junk cars.

The SRT was making a move into an area around behind the barn where I knew, from previous trips to T's World, there was a large enclosure with cats. They suddenly cut loose with gunfire.

With the gunfire, a large male lion came from around the north end of the barn, crossing the lane in front of me. I fired a single shot at the lion as it ran and then went out of my view past a brown junk pick-up truck. As I checked for it, I saw the lion had run about 150 yards to the southwest, out into the field towards a pond and laid down in the open. He was still alive. I called for one of the SRT members who brought a rifle and dispatched the lion.

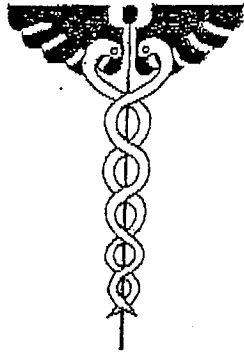
I continued to hold perimeter until a squad arrived. We then moved again to Terry's body where more photos were taken, evidence collected and Terry's body removed.

I stayed with a few members of the SRT while others moved through the area checking for more animals. Once some vehicles were cleared from the area of the barn, I helped move the portable light plant into position where it was fired up and left for the night. I rode out in the Washington Twsp FD SUV and left the scene shortly thereafter.

The time now was about 10:00 PM.

On Friday, 10/21/11, at 8:00 a.m., I had a telephone conversation with Joe Moore, Terry Thompson's Federal Probation Officer. We discussed Thompson's suicide and he related the following information.

He had had recent conversations in person and by telephone with Thompson. P.O. Moore told me they had discussed some of the following topics.

Thompson was to be hooked up to electronic home confinement for one year on today's date. P.O. Moore described Thompson as being "distraught" over being confined to his residence.

Thompson was "overwhelmed" with the farms condition since he had returned home from prison. Thompson had also discussed he had a lot of work to do concerning the cages and animal care. He was concerned over whether or not he would be allowed enough distance on his electronic monitoring device. P.O. Moore had told him that he would be able to work on the farm in order to rectify his concerns over the cages and animals.

Thompson had confirmed he and Marian were "having problems." The specifics of those problems were not disclosed by Thompson.

Thompson knew that Marian was working with a "hitch team" and was at the Coshocton County Fairgrounds doing a show and would be going to the Cleveland area for another show in the near future. He did not know when she would be returning (presumably to the Kopchak Road location).

He said that him obtaining the gun and the subsequent selling of the gun to himself took place when he was a Federal Firearms Dealer and had the part time business of Shooter's Outfitters.

He just barely remembered the gun. The reason he remembered it was he had never had Ruger's, or very many Ruger's.

He thought he might have some records at home that would shed some light on where this gun went. He also believed he had already sent some records into the ATF when he dissolved his business.

He related he will look over the weekend for additional information and try to remember information about this gun.

When asked, he related he thought he got out of his business shortly after the dates of this transaction on the ATF report.

On Monday, October 24th, 2011, at 8:45 a.m., Deputy Paxton came to my office. He related that over the weekend he had searched and was unable to find any other records concerning this gun, other than where he purchased it and sold it to himself. He also indicated he had tried to recall who he may have sold the gun to and was unable to do so.

After completing the interview with Mr. Moore, I reported the information to Sheriff Lutz, and continued to assist him at the forward operations area. We had discussions about the recovery of Mr. Thompson's body. It was decided that Det. Capt. Welker, Evidence Tech Knox and Detective Jones would enter to process the scene.

Once the scene was processed, Dr. Kalis was notified and authorized the removal of Mr. Thompson to the Licking County Forensic Center for an autopsy.

We maintained efforts to contain the perimeter, and account for all animals, until weather and darkness made it too difficult to continue. Operations were suspended until the following day. Deputies remained at the scene to maintain perimeter during the night.

On Wednesday, October 19th, 2011, I returned to the Thompson Farm at about 7:00 a.m. and met with ODNR officers and detectives Wilhite and Hittle along with deputies Lawhorne, Angelo, Williams, Patenaude, Gearhart, Sgt. Kanavel, Jerry Wade and R.J. Wilson.

The deceased animals had to be gathered at a central point so Zoo officials and caretaker Moore could conduct an inventory. During this time, 1 tiger did approach the area. A vet from the Zoo attempted to tranquilize this animal, but was unsuccessful and the tiger was put down.

Zoo officials were successful in taking 3 leopards, 2 monkeys and 1 grizzly bear into custody. These six animals were taken to the Columbus Zoo.

Once a final count of 49 deceased, 6 captured and 1 missing animals was confirmed, a burial site was selected by Mrs. Thompson and was dug by a person she selected. The 49 deceased animals were buried in a single grave.

On 10/18/2011 at approximately 18:00hrs I was at my residence when I was contacted by Sheriff Lutz. Sheriff Lutz advised that several exotic animals were running at large in the area of Kopchak Road. He requested that I respond to the area. I immediately left my residence and responded to the area.

I arrived at the scene and spoke with Sheriff Lutz. Sheriff Lutz advised that a body was located in a field and it was believed to be Terry Thompson. We needed to secure an area around the body and verify it's condition. It was determined that we would approach the body in my county vehicle. Sgt. Blake would operate the vehicle and Deputies Angelo, Paisley, Lawhorne and I would be in the bed of the vehicle.

At 18:27hrs we drove through the gate of the farm. Sgt. Blake had been in the scene earlier and had observed the body. He stated that it was in a field east of the driveway near the residence. We drove to the area to check on the body. We pulled into an area near the barn that would allow us to view the body. We were confronted by two tigers that exited the barn. Both animals were dispatched. I was able to observe the body and it was apparent that the subject was deceased. There were numerous animals in the area that prevented us from approaching on foot. Sheriff Lutz advised that several cats were crossing the south boundary of the property and we needed to stop them. We went to that area and dispatched the animals. We then returned to the area of the body. While securing the area I discovered that cages had been cut along with the doors opened. The damaged cages would prevent any animal from being housed in it. While securing the area a black leopard was located inside its cage and the cage had not been damaged. The area was eventually secured as it was getting dark. We requested additional manpower and for detectives who were assigned to the scene to come to our location.

Captain Welker, Detective Knox, Detective Jones and other officers came to our location. We secured the area so that they could process it. They began to work on the scene when I noticed that there were additional animals behind the barn, which would cause security problems. We stopped processing the scene while we secured the area behind the barn. There were several cages in this area. We observed cats in the cages. We began to clear the area and were able to secure cage doors. As we approached one cage I observed a hole had been cut in the fence. A lion exited the hole and confronted us. The animal was dispatched. We then began to check the cages in the area and discovered that holes had been cut in several areas. The animals escaped the cages and were unrestrained. Several more animals were dispatched in this area. We finally determined that the area was secured to allow the scene to be processed. The scene was processed and we continued to check for unsecured animals.

I left the scene at approximately 22:30hrs.

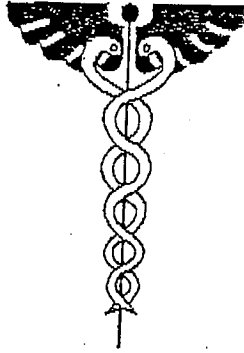

Beneath the jeans and also pulled down to the level of the distal thighs is a pair of white briefs that are completely shredded with only a small amount of dried blood. There is purple infusion of the medial portion of the right upper eyelid, most of the right lower eyelid and purple infusion with edema of the left

upper and lower eyelids. Three $\frac{1}{4}$ - $\frac{5}{8}$ inch dried abrasions without reaction on the right and left chest, several $\frac{1}{8}$ - 1 inch dried abrasions without reaction on bilateral lower abdominal quadrants, a $5\frac{3}{4}$ x 4 inch gaping laceration involving the pubic region and bilateral medial thighs with absence of the genitalia, exposure of the pubic bones and adjacent soft tissue but without reaction. Several $\frac{1}{4}$ - $1\frac{1}{4}$ inch dried abrasions without reaction on the anterior right thigh, lateral and medial surfaces of the right knee, several $\frac{3}{8}$ - $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch dried abrasions without reaction on the lateral left thigh and surrounding the left knee, and dry brown paper bags cover both hands. Head and neck: A $2\frac{1}{4}$ inch vertical laceration on the right lower forehead and along the spine of the nose, three $\frac{3}{8}$ - $\frac{3}{4}$ inch lacerations just medial to the medial canthus of each eye, a few $\frac{1}{16}$ - $\frac{1}{8}$ inch lacerations on the midportion of the lower lip, a $2\frac{1}{4}$ inch diagonal laceration on the right posterior scalp, a $\frac{7}{8}$ inch puncture on the inferior right posterior scalp that is $\frac{3}{4}$ inch deep and penetrates into the deep muscle and fractures the right posterior fossa of the skull. Hemorrhage and lacerations of the right platysma, right trapezius, right sternocleidomastoid, right omohyoid, right mylohyoid, right sternohyoid and right sternothyroid muscles identified. Thyroid gland is homogeneous tan and soft. The pharynx, epiglottis, larynx and trachea are all unremarkable.
- Lungs:** Right - 420 gm, left - 380 gm. External surfaces of all lobes are pink-purple, smooth and glistening. Parenchyma of all lobes is pink-purple and air filled. Bronchi, bronchioles and vasculature unremarkable.
- Lymph nodes:** Within normal limits.

- Liver:** 1720 gm. Lower edge is rounded and parenchyma is tan with the usual consistency and a 0.6 cm diameter firm white nodule.
- Gallbladder:** Has been previously surgically removed.
- Spleen:** 190 gm. Parenchyma is red-purple and firm.
- Pancreas:** Parenchyma is tan, nodular and firm.
- Adrenal glands:** Cortex and medulla unremarkable.
- GI tract:** Lacerations of oral mucosa and gunshot wound to hard and soft palates to be described in detail below. Esophageal mucosa unremarkable. Stomach contains 240cc of thick brown material. The gastric mucosa is arranged in the usual rugal folds. Small bowel wall and mucosa unremarkable. A few diverticula identified within the sigmoid portions of the large bowel. Appendix is present.
- Kidneys:** Right and left are each 140 gm. External surfaces are coarsely granular with scars up to 2.0 cm on the right. Parenchyma within normal limits. The pelves and ureters are unremarkable.
- Bladder:** Contains 50cc of yellow urine. The bladder wall is unremarkable.
- Genitalia:** External - absent due to mutilation. Internal - prostate is enlarged at 100 gm with nodular parenchyma.
- Brain and meninges:** 1270 gm. The external configuration and cut surfaces show maceration of bilateral frontal lobes and bilateral parietal lobes including bilateral basal ganglia due to gunshot wound. The cerebellum and brainstem are unremarkable. Meninges are lacerated.
- Skull:** Fractures of bilateral supraorbital plates, nasal plate, sphenoid, right middle fossa, right petrous ridge, bilateral frontal bones and bilateral parietal bones due to gunshot wound. A 3.0 x 2.4 cm depressed oval fracture present in the right posterior fossa, associated with the previously described puncture wound on the inferior right posterior scalp.
- Ribs and vertebra:** No fractures, however there is subluxation of the manubrio-sternal junction.
- Pelvis:** Subluxation of the pubic symphysis with fracture of right superior pubic ramus.
- Extremities:** No fractures.

Microscopic sections (3):**Oral entrance wound:**

Deep mucosal hemorrhage and many black refractile particles present, consistent with gunpowder residue.

Brain:

Many microlacerations and microhemorrhages.

Liver:

Mild microsteatosis and macrosteatosis. Grossly described nodule consists of a well-demarcated, rounded mass of tubular and angulated bile ductules having cuboid to flattened epithelium. Ductules are within a hyalinized collagenous stroma. These findings are consistent with a bile duct hamartoma.

Toxicology:

1. Diphenhydramine - 0.16 mcg/mL (blood, femoral).
- positive (urine, bladder).
2. Ethanol - not detected.
3. No other agents detected.

Pathological diagnoses:

1. Contact perforating gunshot wound to head (inside mouth). On the hard and soft palates centered 6 ½ inches from the top of the head in the midline is a 1 ¼ inch diameter gunshot entrance wound with soot at the mucosal edges. The hemorrhagic pathway passes through the hard and soft palates, bilateral maxilla causing them to fracture, nasal plate, sphenoid, medial portions of bilateral frontal lobes and bilateral parietal lobes, superior portion of left parietal bone causing external beveling, subcutaneous tissue and exits the skin of the top of the scalp. The ½ x ¼ inch exit wound shows three radiating lacerations up to 1 ½ inches in length and is centered 3/8 inch to the left of sagittal midline at the top of the head. The pathway passes upward, slightly backward and slightly to the left.
2. Perimortem and postmortem mutilation by large feline.
 - a. Neck muscle hemorrhages and lacerations.
 - b. Fractures of right posterior fossa of skull, right mandible and right superior pubic ramus.
 - c. Subluxation of manubrio-sternal joint and pubic symphysis.
 - d. Skin puncture wounds, lacerations and abrasions.
 - e. Traumatic absence of external genitalia.
3. Atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease.
 - a. Right and left anterior descending coronary arteries, severe.
 - b. Aorta, moderate.
4. Hypertensive cardiovascular disease.
 - a. Cardiac ventricular hypertrophy, left (1.8 cm thick).
 - b. Nephrosclerosis.


